Region overview

The workforce profiles provide Census characteristics of employed persons (workers) aged 15 years and over. The data in this profile are based on where people work, as opposed to where people live (usual residence) or where people were counted on Census Night (enumeration).


Southport Statistical Area Level 3 (SA3) is comprised of four statistical area level 2s (SA2's) of Ashmore, Molendinar, Parkwood and Southport.

Southport SA3 has a total area of 35.0 km². Southport SA3 has an average daily temperature range of 15.3 °C to 25.0 °C and on average it receives 1,454 mm of rainfall each year.

Robina Statistical Area Level 3 (SA3) has a total area of 33.7 km². Robina SA3 has an average daily temperature range of 15.3 °C to 25.3 °C and on average it receives 1,526 mm of rainfall each year.

Data are based on Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS), Australian Statistical Geography Standard (ASGS), July 2011.

Figure 1 Map of Southport SA3










Figure 2 Map of Robina SA3







Economy

Age by hours worked

Age by hours worked has been derived from the Working Population Profile from the 2011 Census of Population and Housing. The hours worked variable records the number of hours worked in all jobs held during the week before Census Night. For Census purposes, a person is considered to be working full-time if they worked 35 hours or more in all jobs during the week before Census Night.

The percentage of workers aged 25-54 years employed fulltime in Southport SA3 was

70.0%

Southport SA3

- 49.9% of workers aged 15-24 years worked full-time
- 70.0% of workers aged 25-54 years worked full-time
- 60.1% of workers aged 55 years and over worked full-time

Robina SA3

- 35.8% of workers aged 15-24 years worked full-time
- 64.2% of workers aged 25-54 years worked full-time
- 53.8% of workers aged 55 years and over worked full-time

Total personal income

Total personal income has been derived from the 2011 Census of Population and Housing question 'What is the total of all wages/salaries, government benefits, pensions, allowances and other income a person usually receives?'. These median total personal income estimates have been calculated by Queensland Treasury and Trade using income range data provided by the ABS. The variable is based on persons aged 15 years and over by place of work.

Industry

Industry has been derived from the Working Population Profile from the 2011 Census of Population and Housing data. A person's industry of employment was classified based on responses to a range of questions from the Census.

The top five industry subdivisions of employment for workers in Southport SA3 were:

- 1. Hospitals (10.4%)
- 2. Professional, scientific and technical services (6.0%)
- 3. Tertiary education (5.7%)
- 4. Other store based retailing (5.4%)
- 5. Medical and other health care services (4.8%)

Southport SA3

- 10.9% of workers were employed in the Education and training industry
- Highest specialisation ratio of 5.52 in Manufacturing industry

Robina SA3

- 16.1% of workers were employed in the Retail trade industry
- 15.5% of workers were employed in the Health care and social assistance industry



Industry by hours worked

Industry has been derived from the Working Population Profile from the 2011 Census of Population and Housing data. A person's industry of employment was classified based on responses to a range of questions from the Census. For Census purposes, a person is considered to be working full-time if they worked 35 hours or more in all jobs during the week before Census Night.

The industry with the highest percentage of full-time workers in Southport SA3 was:

Electricity, gas, water and waste services (84.1%)

Southport SA3

- Electricity, gas, water and waste services industry had the highest percentage of full-time workers (84.1%), followed by Construction (82.5%)
- Accommodation and food services industry had the highest percentage of part-time workers (53.1%), followed by Arts and recreation services (45.4%)

Robina SA3

- Electricity, gas, water and waste services industry had the highest percentage of full-time workers (89.3%), followed by Agriculture, forestry and fishing (78.9%)
- Accommodation and food services industry had the highest percentage of part-time workers (60.9%), followed by Retail trade (56.1%)

Industry by occupation

Industry by occupation has been derived from the Working Population Profile from the 2011 Census of Population and Housing data. A person's industry and occupation of employment were classified based on responses to a range of questions from the Census.

The highest percentage of workers in blue collar occupations in Southport SA3 was in the industry:

Construction (17.9%)

Southport SA3

- The percentage of workers employed in blue collar occupations was highest in the Construction industry (17.9%), followed by the Manufacturing industry (17.4%)
- The percentage of workers employed in white collar occupations was highest in the Health care and social assistance industry (25.8%), followed by the Education and training industry (13.9%)

Robina SA3

- The percentage of workers employed in blue collar occupations was highest in the Construction industry (17.4%), followed by the Accommodation and food services industry (14.8%)
- The percentage of workers employed in white collar occupations was highest in the Retail trade industry (17.2%), followed by the Health care and social assistance industry (16.7%)

Occupation has been derived from the Working Population Profile from the 2011 Census of Population and Housing data. A person's occupation of employment was classified based on responses to a range of questions from the Census.

The top five occupation sub-major groups of employment for workers in Southport SA3 were:

- 1. Health professionals (9.6%)
- 2. Sales assistants and sales persons (5.7%)
- 3. Specialist managers (5.6%)
- 4. Education professionals (5.3%)
- Business human resource and marketing professionals (4.4%)

Southport SA3

- 17.7% of workers were employed as Clerical and administrative workers
- Highest specialisation ratio of 3.79 in Machinery operators and drivers occupation



Business counts by employment size

Data are updated annually with an approximate delay of 9 months after the reporting period. It is anticipated the next update will be in July 2014.

Explanatory notes

Profile explanatory notes

Australian Statistical Geography Standard (ASGS)

A geographical framework covering all spatial areas of Australia and its external territories. The ASGS was developed by the ABS to allow statistics from different collections to be spatially comparable. The ASGS came into effect in July 2011, replacing the Australian Standard Geographical Classification (ASGC). The 2011 edition of the ASGS has been used for the data in this report.

Blue collar

Defined as occupation groups: Technicians and Trades Workers, Machinery Operators and Drivers, and Labourers.

Cell confidentialisation

This profile utilises two types of data confidentialisation.

- 1. Source data confidentialisation This refers to datasets that have been confidentialised by the data custodians. For example census data supplied by the ABS have small cell counts of 1 or 2 confidentialised to 0 or 3 and a small random adjustment made to all data to avoid any risk of releasing identifiable information. Caution should therefore be used when interpreting data where the cell count is small.
- 2. Concordance confidentialisation This refers to datasets that have been concorded to a new geography and the resulting cell count is small. No reliance should be placed on these cell counts and as such have been confidentialised. Tables utilising this type of confidentialisation will report the cell as less than a specific value (for example <5).

Census 2011 data

Census data have 'introduced random error' to ensure no data are released which could risk identifying individuals. As such, cells containing very small counts should be treated with extreme caution.

Census undercount

Due to the size and complexity of the Census of Population and Housing, whenever a Census is conducted it is inevitable that some people will be missed and some will be counted more than once. After each Census, the Australian Bureau of Statistics conduct a Post Enumeration Survey to estimate the number of people who should have been counted in the Census and the actual Census counts. It is important to note, that all Census data reported in this profile do not have any adjustments made for Census undercount and readers should keep this in mind when making inferences from the data.

Concordances and concorded data

A concordance, in statistical terms, is a product that allows a user to convert data from one geographical region (under which data have been collected) to a new geographical region. In order to convert data from one geographical boundary to another, each region in the new boundary is assigned percentages of data from the old regions. These percentages in the concordance can be constructed using any number of variables. This profile utilises a population based concordance (estimated resident population) at a specific point in time (2011). This type of concordance is useful when concording demographic based datasets such as labour force and family composition on a usual resident basis with time periods at or around 2011. It does not work as well when concording data on different counting methods (such as counts by place of work), non-population based datasets (such as business counts) or datasets collected at different time periods (such as data collected in 2001). Caution should therefore be used when interpreting non-resident based datasets that have been concorded.

One major assumption that is necessary to make when concording data is that the data (for example unemployed persons) are proportionately distributed across the region the same as total resident population (as total resident population is the variable used to derive the percentage splits). In some cases this assumption will not be entirely correct. In the example of unemployed persons, within the region there may be more concentrated areas with a larger proportion of unemployed persons. This assumption should therefore be considered when interpreting datasets that have been concorded.

Industry

Based on Australian and New Zealand Standard Industrial Classification (ANZSIC), 2006 edition.

Industry Subdivision

The industry subdivision refers to the 2-digit industry classification from the Australian and New Zealand Standard Industrial Classification (ANZSIC), 2006 edition.

Occupation

Based on Australian and New Zealand Standard Classification of Occupations (ANZSCO), 2006 edition (Revision 1).

Occupation sub-major group

The occupation sub-major group refers to the 2-digit occupation classification from the Australian and New Zealand Standard Classification of Occupations (ANZSCO), 2006 edition (Revision 1).

Rounding

Figures are rounded to nearest whole number. Calculations (such as percentages and rates) are based on pre-rounded figures.

Specialisation ratio

The ratio of the percentage for the Southport SA3 to the percentage for Robina SA3. A specialisation ratio above 1.00 indicates Southport SA3 has a larger share for that category than in Robina SA3. Similarly a specialisation ratio below 1.00 indicates Southport SA3 has a smaller share for that category than in Robina SA3.

Statistical Area Level 2

Statistical Area Level 2s (SA2s) (2011) are small areas, approximately suburb size, with approximately 3,000 people each. There are 526 SA2 regions that cover the state.

Statistical Area Level 3

Statistical Area Level 3s (SA3s) (2011) are aggregations of SA2s areas, with approximately 30,000 people each. There are 80 SA3 regions that cover the state.

White collar

Defined as occupation groups: Managers, Professionals, Community and Personal Service Workers, Clerical and Administrative Workers and Sales Workers.

Workers

The term 'workers' has been used throughout this report to describe employed persons counted in the location of where they worked.

Topic explanatory notes

Business counts

It is not currently possible to account for those businesses which operate out of multiple locations, other than at their main location. This is particularly relevant for larger businesses, which commonly establish outlets in several or all states and many regions across Australia. The reason for this is that data pertaining to individual business locations are not currently available from the Australian Bureau of Statistics Business Register. Users should therefore be aware of this limitation when using counts of businesses included in this table.

Business counts by industry

Based on Australian and New Zealand Standard Industrial Classification (ANZSIC), 2006 edition.

Total personal income

Median total personal income estimates have been calculated by Queensland Treasury and Trade using income data provided by the ABS.
